Significant Events

On 1/27/16 the Parent Education visit was dedicated to the handout "Assure Baby's Physical Development" by Pathways.org. Mom was given a copy of the handout, and the topics discussed were typical speech development, and early detection on physical development. During the visit, CSH worker observed Ms. being appropriate with her baby. She was attentive and responded to her child's cry.

On 2/1/16 the visit concluded the "Assure Baby's Physical Development" Pathways.org. The topic concluded with a picture chart of the typical play development and typical physical development. Furthermore Ms. sign a consent form in order for CSH worker could initiate communication with the program's supervisor and Ms. Pelletier's case manager.

On 2/11/16 CSH worker provided mom with a new mother's questionnaire, in order to get a better understanding of were Ms. stands as a first time mother. CSH worker also met mom's case worker

On 2/18/16 Mom informed worker that the child had his first vaccine shot on 2/17/16, and according to the doctor there is no concerns or issues with the child's health and development. Moreover she stated that according to the doctor the child is at a six month developmental level. She stated that the child is currently teething, which has affected his sleeping routine. The child is currently waking up three times a night, and napping once during the day. CSH worker informed mom that the next parent education session would be dedicated to teething, and the development of a sleeping routine for the afternoon.

On 2/25/16 The visit focused on her transition out of the program once she completes the services. Possible schooling and training were discussed; as CSH worker provided Ms. with course description from Holyoke Community College. Furthermore job placement was discussed, and a calendar of events, training, and job fairs from career point was provided to Ms. The final subject discussed was housing, which Ms. explained her plan. She explained that she is planning to move to her brother's apartment for a short stay until she gets her own place. CSH worker provided information on a number of housing assistance program, including RAFT, HAP housing, and family shelter provided by DTA. CSH worker handed Ms. Pelletier a number of vouchers and contact information in regards to housing.

On 3/3/16 CSH worker presented mom with information on curriculum for infants and toddlers. The subject discussed were distinctions between Infant/Toddler and preschool curricula, and developmentally appropriate practices and infant/toddler curriculum

Family will be monitored for consistency and engagement with services, follow through with DCF and The Children's Study Home service plan tasks, and use of services to build on their family strengths.

It was agreed to meet for parent education on Mondays at 12:30 pm and Thursdays at 12pm at The Gandara Women's Program site. Ms. has demonstrated a willingness to better her situation and enhance her role as a mother, which has reflected with her cooperation during the service period. Moreover Ms. I has maintained her sobriety; acknowledging her safety/crisis plan as a source of back up in the case of a relapse.
